5 28-518 (1) Theft constitutes a Class IIA felony when the value of 6 the thing involved is <u>ten five</u> thousand dollars or more.

7 (2) Theft constitutes a Class III felony when the value of the thing
8 involved is five thousand dollars or more but less than ten thousand
9 dollars.

10 <u>(3)</u> (2) Theft constitutes a Class IV felony when the value of the 11 thing involved is one thousand five hundred dollars or more but less than 12 five thousand dollars.

(4) (3) Theft constitutes a Class I misdemeanor when the value of
 the thing involved is more than five hundred dollars but less than one
 thousand five hundred dollars.

16 <u>(5)</u> (4) Theft constitutes a Class II misdemeanor when the value of 17 the thing involved is five hundred dollars or less.

(6) (5) For any second or subsequent conviction under subsection (4)
 (3) of this section, any person so offending shall be guilty of a Class
 IV felony.

21 (7) (6) For any second conviction under subsection (5) (4) of this 22 section, any person so offending shall be guilty of a Class I 23 misdemeanor, and for any third or subsequent conviction under subsection 24 (5) (4) of this section, the person so offending shall be guilty of a 25 Class IV felony.

26 <u>(8)</u> (7) Amounts taken pursuant to one scheme or course of conduct 27 from one or more persons may be aggregated in the indictment or

information in determining the classification of the offense, except that
 amounts may not be aggregated into more than one offense.

3 (9) (8) In any prosecution for theft under sections 28-509 to 4 28-518, value shall be an essential element of the offense that must be 5 proved beyond a reasonable doubt.
