Nebraska Revised Statute 68-1735.02 requires the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to report annually to the Legislature by October 1 information regarding persons participating in an Employment First Self-Sufficiency Contract engaged in certain educational activities. In addition, DHHS is required to report information on persons who obtain or maintain employment after being no longer eligible for Aid to the Dependent Children (ADC) cash assistance.
