Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Section 1 would amend Sec. 81-1807 to prohibit a notarization requirement for an application form for compensation under the Crime Victim's Reparations Act.

Section 2 would eliminate a requirement in Sec. 81-1821 that an incident or offense be reported within three days to be

eligible for compensation under the Crime Victim's Reparations Act. This exception would only apply to victims of sexual assault, domestic assault, and sex trafficking and only if the victim has reported the crime, obtained a protection order, or presented for a forensic medical exam. Explanation of amendments: AM108 would add child abuse to the list of offenses excepted from the three day reporting requirement.
