## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

The bill expands the 50% exclusion from income tax for military retirement benefits that commences with taxable years beginning or deemed to begin on or after January 1, 2022 to 100%.

## **Explanation of amendments:**

The committee voted to adopt Committee Amendment 291: 8 Yes - Linehan, Lindstrom, Albrecht, Bostar, Briese, Flood, Friesen, Pahls

The amendment incorporates the provisions of LB6. This allows military retirees to provide a form 1099 from either the Department of Defense or the Office of Personnel Management to claim the exemption for military retirement benefits.

Portions/Provisions of LB6 were amended to LB387.
