Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Section 1 would amend Sec. 81-1801 to add definitions of "domestic assault", "health care provider", and "sexual assault" to the Crime Victim's Reparation Act.

Section 2 would amend Sec. 81-1807 to allow health care providers to be reimbursed as compensation under the Crime Victim's Reparations Act for costs incurred in treating or examining a victim of sexual assault or domestic assault that are not otherwise paid or reimbursed.

Section 3 would amend Sec. 81-1808 to insert a reference to health care providers in a section related to the documentation necessary for compensation.

Section 4 would amend Sec. 81-1815 to authorize a hearing officer to order compensation to a health care provider in the event that a victim is injured or killed.

Explanation of amendments:

AM132 would require a health care provider to obtain the permission of the victim before applying for reimbursement for health care costs.

The amendment would also add child abuse to the list of offenses eligible for reimbursement and harmonize language related to domestic assault.
