Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB681 would conform Nebraska to the federal changes regarding "529 Plans" under the College Savings Plan Program.

The federal changes allow for contributions to a plan to be used to pay tuition at an elementary or secondary school of choice. LB681 would allow such contributions to qualify for the existing 529 Plan deduction of up to \$5,000 for married filing

separate taxpayers or \$10,000 for all other returns.

The Act would become operative on January 1, 2022. Therefore, the deduction would become effective for tax years beginning or deemed to begin on or after January 1, 2022.
