## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB6 changes boundaries of the Supreme Court judicial districts by the adoption of maps by reference.

The state is divided into six Supreme Court judicial districts. The overall range of deviation is approximately 3 percent. Districts are drawn using census geography and population data from the 2020 US Census.

The maps are to be kept in the Secretary of State%u2019s Office.

The bill includes an emergency clause.
