LB7 changes the boundaries of the State Board of Education by the adoption of maps by reference.

The state is divided into eight State Board of Education districts. The overall range of deviation is approximately 6 percent. Districts are drawn using census geography and population data from the 2020 US Census.

The maps are to be kept in the Secretary of State's Office.

The bill includes an emergency clause.
