This bill would increase the salary of the Supreme Court judges. This change would also increase the salaries of the judges of the Court of Appeals, the District Court, the Separate Juvenile Court, the Workers Compensation Court, and the County Court as these salaries are a percent of the salary of the Supreme Court judges. Judges' salaries would increase by 3.00% on July 1, 2021, and by 3.00% on July 1, 2022.

This act becomes operative on July 1, 2021, and it has the emergency clause.

The bill will increase the salaries of the judges as follows:

COMMENTS: LB 386 Increases the Salary level of the Supreme Court Judges by 3% in each of FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23. The Workers' Compensation Court Judges' salaries are based on 92.5% of the Supreme Court Judges' salary level. Given the salary increase over the FY 2020-21 base, plus applying a .1515 Payroll Tax loading factor, I calculate the impact to the Workers' Compensation Court to be approximately \$2,634 higher in FY 2021-22 and \$4,766 higher in FY 2022-23 than the impacts shown in the Agency Fiscal Note.

Explanation of Estimate:

As provided in Section 48-159, "...each judge of the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court shall receive an annual salary of ninety-two and one-half percent of the salary set for the Chief Justice and judges of the Supreme Court..."

Therefore, if the Supreme Court judges receive an increase in salary, the Workers' Compensation Court judges also receive an increase. The benefits increase is for FICA and the Medicare Surcharge for the additional salary amount.

LB 386 provides for a 3% increase on July 1, 2021 and a 3% increase on July 1, 2022.
