1 Section 1. Section 38-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 20 Sec. 2. Section 38-129.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 21 2020, is amended to read:
- 22 38-129.01 (1) The department, with the recommendation of the
- 23 appropriate board, shall issue a temporary credential to a military
- 24 spouse who complies with and meets the requirements of this section
- 25 pending issuance of the applicable credential under the Uniform
- 26 Credentialing Act. This section shall not apply to a license to practice
- 27 dentistry, including a temporary license under section 38-1123.
- 28 (2) A military spouse shall submit the following with his or her
- 29 application for the applicable credential:
- 30 (a) A copy of his or her military dependent identification card
- 31 which identifies him or her as the spouse of an active duty member of the

- 1 United States Armed Forces;
- 2 (b) A copy of his or her spouse's military orders reflecting an
- 3 active-duty assignment in Nebraska;
- 4 (c) A copy of his or her credential from another jurisdiction and
- 5 the applicable statutes, rules, and regulations governing the credential;
- 6 and
- 7 (d) A copy of his or her fingerprints for a criminal background
- 8 check if required under section 38-131.
- 9 (3) If the department, with the recommendation of the appropriate
- 10 board, determines that the applicant is a resident of Nebraska, is the
- 11 spouse of an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces who is
- 12 assigned to a duty station in Nebraska, holds a valid credential in
- 13 another jurisdiction which has similar standards for the profession to
- 14 the Uniform Credentialing Act and the rules and regulations adopted and
- 15 promulgated under the act, and has submitted fingerprints for a criminal
- 16 background check if required under section 38-131, the department shall
- 17 issue a temporary credential to the applicant. The applicant shall not be
- 18 required to pay any fees pursuant to the Uniform Credentialing Act for
- 19 the temporary credential or the initial regular credential except the
- 20 actual cost of the fingerprinting and criminal background check for an
- 21 initial license under section 38-131.
- 22 (4) A temporary credential issued under this section shall be valid
- 23 until the application for the regular credential is approved or rejected,
- 24 not to exceed one year.
- 25 Sec. 3. (1) This section provides an additional method of issuing a
- 26 <u>credential based on reciprocity and is supplemental to the methods of</u>
- 27 <u>credentialing found in the various practice acts within the Uniform</u>
- 28 Credentialing Act. Any person required to be credentialed under any of
- 29 the various practice acts who meets the requirements of this section
- 30 <u>shall be issued a credential subject to the provisions of this section.</u>
- 31 (2) A person who has a credential that is current and valid in

- 1 another state, a territory of the United States, or the District of
- 2 <u>Columbia may apply to the department for the equivalent credential under</u>
- 3 the Uniform Credentialing Act. The department, with the recommendation of
- 4 the board with jurisdiction over the equivalent credential, shall
- 5 determine the appropriate level of credential for which the applicant
- 6 qualifies under this section. The department shall determine the
- 7 documentation required to comply with subsection (3) of this section. The
- 8 department shall issue the credential if the applicant meets the
- 9 requirements of subsections (3) and (4) of this section and section
- 10 38-129 and submits the appropriate fees for issuance of the credential,
- 11 <u>including fees for a criminal background check if required for the</u>
- 12 <u>profession. A credential issued under this section shall not be valid for</u>
- 13 purposes of an interstate compact or for reciprocity provisions of any
- 14 practice act under the Uniform Credentialing Act.
- 15 (3) The applicant shall provide documentation of the following:
- 16 <u>(a) The credential held in the other state, territory, or District</u>
- 17 <u>of Columbia, the level of such credential, and the profession for which</u>
- 18 <u>credentialed;</u>
- 19 (b) Such credential is valid and current and has been valid for at
- 20 <u>least one year;</u>
- 21 <u>(c) Educational requirements;</u>
- 22 (d) The minimum work experience and clinical supervision
- 23 requirements, if any, required for such credential and verification of
- 24 the applicant's completion of such requirements;
- 25 (e) The passage of an examination for such credential if such
- 26 passage is required to obtain the credential in the other jurisdiction;
- 27 <u>(f) Such credential is not and has not been subject to revocation or</u>
- 28 any other disciplinary action or voluntarily surrendered while the
- 29 applicant was under investigation for unprofessional conduct or any other
- 30 <u>conduct which would be subject to section 38-178 if the conduct occurred</u>
- 31 in Nebraska;

- 1 (g) Such credential has not been subject to disciplinary action. If
- 2 another jurisdiction has taken disciplinary action against the applicant
- 3 on any credential the applicant has held, the appropriate board under the
- 4 Uniform Credentialing Act shall determine if the cause for the
- 5 disciplinary action was corrected and the matter resolved. If the matter
- 6 has not been resolved, the applicant is not eligible for a credential
- 7 under this section until the matter is resolved; and
- 8 <u>(h) Receipt of a passing score on a credentialing examination</u>
- 9 specific to the laws of Nebraska if required by the appropriate board
- 10 under the Uniform Credentialing Act.
- 11 (4) An applicant who obtains a credential upon compliance with
- 12 subsections (2) and (3) of this section shall establish residency in
- 13 Nebraska within one hundred eighty days after the issuance of the
- 14 <u>credential</u> and shall provide proof of residency in a manner and within
- 15 the time period required by the department. The department shall
- 16 automatically revoke the credential of any credential holder who fails to
- 17 comply with this subsection.
- 18 (5) In addition to failure to submit the required documentation in
- 19 <u>subsection (3) of this section, an applicant shall not be eligible for a</u>
- 20 <u>credential under this section if:</u>
- 21 (a) The applicant had a credential revoked, subject to any other
- 22 disciplinary action, or voluntarily surrendered due to an investigation
- 23 in any jurisdiction for unprofessional conduct or any other conduct which
- 24 would be subject to section 38-178 if the conduct occurred in Nebraska;
- 25 (b) The applicant has a complaint, allegation, or investigation
- 26 pending before any jurisdiction that relates to unprofessional conduct or
- 27 <u>any other conduct which would be subject to section 38-178 if the conduct</u>
- 28 <u>occurred in Nebraska. If the matter has not been resolved, the applicant</u>
- 29 <u>is not eligible for a credential under this section until the matter is</u>
- 30 <u>resolved; or</u>
- 31 (c) The person has a disqualifying criminal history as determined by

- 3 <u>(6) A person who holds a credential under this section shall be</u>
- 4 subject to the Uniform Credentialing Act and other laws of this state

- 7 (7) This section applies to credentials for:
- 8 <u>(a) Professions governed by the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse</u>
- 9 Practice Act, the Certified Nurse Midwifery Practice Act, the Certified
- 10 Registered Nurse Anesthetist Practice Act, the Clinical Nurse Specialist
- 11 <u>Practice Act, the Dentistry Practice Act, the Dialysis Patient Care</u>
- 12 <u>Technician Registration Act, the Emergency Medical Services Practice Act,</u>
- 13 the Medical Nutrition Therapy Practice Act, the Medical Radiography
- 14 Practice Act, the Nurse Practitioner Practice Act, the Optometry Practice
- 15 Act, the Perfusion Practice Act, the Pharmacy Practice Act, the
- 16 Psychology Practice Act, and the Surgical First Assistant Practice Act;
