- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Quality Education Accountability Act;
- to amend section 79-760.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
- and section 79-760.06, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020;
- 4 to require tracking of student discipline as prescribed; to provide
- 5 duties; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
- 6 sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 79-760.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,

- 2 is amended to read:
- 3 79-760.05 (1) The State Board of Education shall implement a
- 4 statewide system for tracking individual student achievement, using the
- 5 student identifier system of the State Department of Education, that can
- 6 be aggregated to track student progress by demographic characteristics,
- 7 including, but not limited to, race, poverty, high mobility, attendance,
- 8 and limited English proficiency, on available measures of student
- 9 achievement which include, but need not be limited to, national
- 10 assessment instruments, state assessment instruments, and the indicators
- 11 used in the accountability system required pursuant to section 79-760.06.
- 12 Such a system shall be designed so as to aggregate student data by
- 13 available educational input characteristics, which may include class
- 14 size, teacher education, teacher experience, special education, early
- 15 childhood programs, federal programs, and other targeted education
- 16 programs. School districts shall provide the department with individual
- 17 student achievement data from assessment instruments required pursuant to
- 18 section 79-760.03 in order to implement the statewide system.
- 19 (2)(a) On or before August 1, 2022, the board shall also implement a
- 20 statewide system for tracking individual student discipline, using the
- 21 student identifier system of the department, that can be aggregated to
- 22 track student discipline by type of discipline and demographic
- 23 <u>characteristics</u>, <u>including</u>, <u>but not limited to, race</u>, <u>poverty</u>, <u>high</u>
- 24 <u>mobility</u>, <u>attendance</u>, <u>disability</u>, <u>and limited English profici</u>ency. The
- 25 board shall cause each school district to report, by individual student,
- 26 <u>any:</u>
- 27 (i) Act resulting in an in-school suspension, a short-term
- 28 suspension, a long-term suspension, a one-semester expulsion, a two-
- 29 <u>semester expulsion, an assignment to an alternative school or</u>
- 30 <u>alternative-learning program, the use of physical contact with such</u>
- 31 student, or the restraint or seclusion of such student;

- 1 (ii) Offense constituting grounds for a long-term suspension, an
- 2 expulsion, or a mandatory reassignment pursuant to section 79-267,
- 3 <u>regardless of consequences assigned; and</u>
- 4 (iii) Act resulting in law enforcement involvement, including any
- 5 incident reported to law enforcement or to an on-site school resource
- 6 officer, and any school-related citation or arrest.
- 7 <u>(b) For purposes of this subsection, school-related citation or</u>
- 8 arrest shall include a citation or arrest of a student for any activity
- 9 conducted on school grounds; in a vehicle owned, leased, or contracted by
- 10 <u>a school being used for a school purpose or in a vehicle being driven for</u>
- 11 <u>a school purpose by a school employee or by such employee's designee; or</u>
- 12 <u>at a school-sponsored activity or athletic event.</u>
- 13 (c) The system for tracking individual student discipline may also
- 14 <u>be used to record other disciplinary incidents.</u>
- 15 <u>(d) Each school shall designate at least one discipline data</u>
- 16 <u>coordinator for the purposes of gathering and reporting the discipline</u>
- 17 data required pursuant to this subsection.
- 18 (3) (2) The department shall annually analyze and report on student
- 19 achievement and on student discipline for the state, each school
- 20 district, each public school, and each learning community aggregated by
- 21 the demographic characteristics described in subsection (1) of this
- 22 section. The department shall report the findings to the Governor, the
- 23 Legislature, school districts, educational service units, and each
- 24 learning community. The report submitted to the Legislature shall be
- 25 submitted electronically. Such analysis shall include aggregated data
- 26 that would indicate differences in achievement and differences in student
- 27 <u>discipline</u> due to available educational input characteristics described
- 28 in subsection (1) of this section. Such analysis shall include indicators
- 29 of progress toward state achievement goals for students in poverty,
- 30 limited English proficient students, students with disabilities, and
- 31 highly mobile students.

Sec. 2. Section 79-760.06, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2020, is amended to read:
- 3 79-760.06 (1) The On or before August 1, 2012, the State Board of
- 4 Education shall establish an accountability system to be used to measure
- 5 the performance of individual public schools and school districts. The
- 6 accountability system shall combine multiple indicators, including, but
- 7 not limited to, graduation rates, student growth and student improvement
- 8 on the assessment instruments provided in section 79-760.03, student
- 9 <u>discipline</u>, and other indicators of the performance of public schools and
- 10 school districts as established by the state board.
- 11 (2) <u>The</u> Beginning with the reporting of data from school year
- 12 2014-15, the indicators selected by the state board for the
- 13 accountability system shall be combined annually into a school
- 14 performance score and district performance score. The state board shall
- 15 establish levels of performance based upon school performance scores and
- 16 district performance scores in order to annually classify and report the
- 17 performance of public schools and school districts beginning with the
- 18 reporting of data from school year 2014-15. The department shall classify
- 19 and report the performance of public schools and school districts
- 20 annually on or before December 31 of each calendar year.
- 21 (3) The state board shall designate priority schools based on such
- 22 classification. Schools designated as priority schools shall be at the
- 23 lowest performance level at the time of the initial priority school
- 24 designation. Schools designated as priority schools shall remain priority
- 25 schools until such designation is removed by the state board. No less
- 26 than three schools may have a priority school designation at one time.
- 27 Schools designated as priority schools shall be subject to the
- 28 requirements of section 79-760.07. The State Department of Education
- 29 shall annually report the performance level of individual public schools
- 30 and school districts as part of the statewide assessment and reporting
- 31 system.
