- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Credentialing Act; to amend
- 2 section 38-1708, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections
- 3 38-101, 38-121, and 38-186, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 4 2020; to adopt the Reflexologist Registration Act; to provide an
- 5 exemption from the Massage Therapy Practice Act; to harmonize
- 6 provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

- 6 (2) No individual shall hold himself or herself out as any of the
- 7 following until such individual has obtained a credential under the
- 8 Uniform Credentialing Act for that purpose:
- 9 (a) Registered environmental health specialist;
- 10 (b) Certified marriage and family therapist;
- 11 (c) Certified professional counselor;
- 12 (d) Social worker;—or

- 25 Sec. 3. Section 38-186, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 26 2020, is amended to read:
- 27 38-186 (1) A petition shall be filed by the Attorney General in
- 28 order for the director to discipline a credential obtained under the
- 29 Uniform Credentialing Act to:
- 30 (a) Practice or represent oneself as being certified under any of
- 31 the practice acts enumerated in subdivisions (1) through (19) and (21)

- 1 through (36) (35) of section 38-101; or
- 2 (b) Operate as a business for the provision of services in body art;
- 3 cosmetology; emergency medical services; esthetics; funeral directing and
- 4 embalming; massage therapy; and nail technology in accordance with
- 5 subsection (3) of section 38-121.
- 6 (2) The petition shall be filed in the office of the director. The
- 7 department may withhold a petition for discipline or a final decision
- 8 from public access for a period of five days from the date of filing the
- 9 petition or the date the decision is entered or until service is made,
- 10 whichever is earliest.
- 11 (3) The proceeding shall be summary in its nature and triable as an
- 12 equity action and shall be heard by the director or by a hearing officer
- 13 designated by the director under rules and regulations of the department.
- 14 Affidavits may be received in evidence in the discretion of the director
- 15 or hearing officer. The department shall have the power to administer
- 16 oaths, to subpoena witnesses and compel their attendance, and to issue
- 17 subpoenas duces tecum and require the production of books, accounts, and
- 18 documents in the same manner and to the same extent as the district
- 19 courts of the state. Depositions may be used by either party.
- Sec. 4. Section 38-1708, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 21 amended to read:
- 22 38-1708 The Massage Therapy Practice Act shall not be construed to
- 23 include the following classes of persons:
- 24 (1) Licensed physicians and surgeons, osteopathic physicians,
- 25 chiropractors, registered nurses, practical nurses, cosmetologists,
- 26 estheticians, nail technicians, physical therapists, barbers, and other
- 27 persons credentialed under the Uniform Credentialing Act who are
- 28 exclusively engaged in the practice of their respective professions;
- 29 (2) Physicians who serve in the armed forces of the United States or
- 30 the United States Public Health Service or who are employed by the United
- 31 States Department of Veterans Affairs or other federal agencies, if their

- practice is limited to that service or employment;
- 2 (3) Students performing massage therapy services when they render
- 3 such services within the scope of an approved massage therapy school
- 4 under the supervision of a licensed massage therapist;—and
- 5 (4) Individuals who hold a current license as a massage therapist in
- 6 another state and who travel with and provide massage therapy services to
- 7 theatrical groups, entertainers, or athletic organizations; and -
- 8 (5) Individuals engaged in the practice of reflexology as defined in
- 9 <u>section 7 of this act.</u>
- Sec. 5. <u>Sections 5 to 10 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
- 11 <u>cited as the Reflexologist Registration Act.</u>
- Sec. 6. The purpose of the Reflexologist Registration Act is to
- 13 ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the public by providing for the
- 14 <u>accurate, cost-effective, efficient, and safe utilization of registered</u>
- 15 <u>reflexologists in the practice of reflexology.</u>
- 16 Sec. 7. For purposes of the Reflexologist Registration Act:
- 17 (1) Board means the Board of Massage Therapy; and
- 18 (2) Practice of reflexology means services which are limited to the
- 19 application of specific pressure, by the use of the practitioner's hands,
- 20 thumbs, and fingers, to the soft tissue of the hands, feet, and outer
- 21 <u>ears and which are not designated or implied to be massage or massage</u>
- therapy.
- 23 Sec. 8. On and after October 1, 2021, no person shall engage in the
- 24 practice of reflexology for remuneration unless such person is listed in
- 25 the reflexologist registry created under section 9 of this act.
- Sec. 9. <u>The reflexologist registry is created. The department shall</u>
- 27 <u>ensure that the reflexologist registry is operational on or before</u>
- 28 September 16, 2021, and shall list each reflexologist's registration on
- 29 the reflexologist registry. The board shall provide supervision and
- 30 <u>oversight of the reflexologist registry.</u>
- 31 Sec. 10. <u>To register as a reflexologist, an individual shall file</u>

- 1 an application with the department and pay the applicable fee determined
- 2 by the department. The department shall charge a fee which reasonably
- 3 covers but does not exceed the department's cost of maintaining the
- 4 reflexologist registry. In lieu of the requirements of sections 38-123
- 5 and 38-130, the application shall include the name, address, and
- 6 telephone number of the reflexologist, documentation of certification
- 7 based on successful completion by the reflexologist of the examination
- 8 given by the American Reflexology Certification Board or the Reflexology
- 9 Certification Board, and the expiration date of such certification. In
- 10 lieu of the requirements of section 38-145, to remain on the
- 11 reflexologist registry, the reflexologist shall maintain such
- 12 <u>certification with the applicable board in good standing and annually</u>
- 13 provide evidence of such certification to the department.

- 15 Nebraska, and sections 38-101, 38-121, and 38-186, Revised Statutes
- 16 Cumulative Supplement, 2020, are repealed.
