Introduced by Speaker Hilgers, 21; at the request of the Governor.

Read first time January 14, 2021

Committee: Appropriations

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend Laws 2019, LB294,
2 sections 93, 96, 108, 159, 181, 182, and 261; and Laws 2020, LB1008,
3 sections 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, and 55; to define terms; to
4 provide, change, and eliminate appropriations for operation of state
5 government; to change fund transfers; to repeal the original
6 sections; and to declare an emergency.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by
3 the One Hundred Seventh Legislature, First or Second Session, which
4 appropriates funds, FY2019-20 means the period July 1, 2019, through June
5 30, 2020; FY2020-21 means the period July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021;
6 FY2021-22 means the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022; FY2022-23
7 means the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023; FY2023-24 means the
8 period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024; and FY2024-25 means the
9 period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.

10 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.

11 There are hereby appropriated, for FY2019-20 and FY2020-21, the sums
12 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective
13 funds for the general operations of state government, postsecondary
14 education, capital construction, and state aid, except as otherwise
15 appropriated.

16 Sec. 3. UNEXPENDED BALANCES AND CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES.

17 All General Fund appropriations existing on June 30, 2019, in excess
18 of expended and certified encumbrance amounts are hereby lapsed unless
19 otherwise provided. All Cash Fund and Revolving Fund appropriations
20 existing on June 30, 2019, in excess of expended and certified
21 encumbrance amounts are hereby lapsed unless otherwise expressly
22 provided. All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2019, and June
23 30, 2020, are hereby reappropriated for FY2019-20 and FY2020-21,
24 respectively, which amounts shall be in addition to the amounts shown in
25 this act.

26 Sec. 4. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCES, FY2019-20 to FY2020-21.

27 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are
28 hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances existing on
29 June 30, 2020, for FY2020-21 to the respective agencies, programs, and
30 funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided in this act.

31 Sec. 5. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.

1 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual,
2 and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature are
3 hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act, except
4 as provided in section 27 of this act.

5 Sec. 6. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.

6 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the
7 proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the
8 appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper
9 documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the
10 appropriate funds.

26 (1) For purposes of this act, (a) SALARY LIMIT shall mean total
27 expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems and (b)
28 total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems
29 shall mean all remuneration paid to employees treated as taxable
30 compensation by the Internal Revenue Service or subject to social
31 security coverage, specifically including payments accounted for as

1 vacation, holidays, sick leave, military leave, funeral leave, maternity
2 leave, administrative leave, compensatory time, deferred compensation, or
3 any other similar form, and amounts withheld pursuant to law, but
4 excluding state contributions for social security, retirement, and
5 employee insurance plans.

6 (2) Total expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per
7 diems shall be limited to the amount shown except when federal funds in
8 excess of the amount shown are available and approved by the Governor.
9 Expenditures for permanent and temporary salaries and per diems from such
10 grants shall be in addition to the limitation on permanent and temporary
11 salaries and per diems otherwise shown in this act. No agency shall
12 request any state funds for continuation or replacement of any such
