- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.
- 2 For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by
- 3 the One Hundred Seventh Legislature, First or Second Session, which
- 4 appropriates funds, FY2020-21 means the period July 1, 2020, through June
- 5 30, 2021, FY2021-22 means the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022,
- 6 FY2022-23 means the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, FY2023-24
- 7 means the period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, and FY2024-25 means
- 8 the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.
- 9 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.
- There are hereby appropriated, for FY2021-22 and FY2022-23, the sums
- 11 set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective
- 12 funds for capital construction projects, land acquisition, lease-purchase
- 13 arrangements, and major equipment acquisition, except as otherwise
- 14 appropriated.
- 15 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2021-22 to FY2022-23.
- In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are
- 17 hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances existing on
- 18 June 30, 2022, for FY2022-23 to the respective agencies, programs, and
- 19 funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided in this act.
- 20 Sec. 4. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.
- The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual,
- 22 and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature are
- 23 hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act.
- 24 Sec. 5. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS.
- 25 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the
- 26 proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the
- 27 appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper
- 28 documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the
- 29 appropriate funds.
- 30 Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that the appropriations
- 31 for capital facilities follow an orderly and reasonable process based

1 upon defined and documented need and an analysis of the utilization of

2 existing facilities.

3 The biennial appropriations contained in this act covering FY2021-22 4 and FY2022-23, which have been designated for planning, require from the agency a complete program statement prepared in accordance with the 5 Procedural Manual for Capital Construction as approved by the state 6 7 building division of the Department of Administrative Services. Projects directly related to program continuation such as fire and life safety, 8 utility improvements, 9 maintenance, handicapped access, and planning require a statement of needs prepared in accordance with the 10 manual. An appropriation for drawings and construction may be recommended 11 only after submission of an acceptable program statement or statement of 12 13 needs on or before September 15 to the state building division, the 14 budget division of the Department of Administrative Services, and the 15 Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

Program statements that have been submitted prior to FY2021-22 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2021, to September 1, 2021. Program statements that have been submitted prior to FY2022-23 shall be updated if necessary and resubmitted during the period July 1, 2022, to September 1, 2022, by agency priority. Such priority shall be subject to final modification by the governing authority of each agency on or before September 15, 2022.

It is the intent of the Legislature that agencies should 23 24 construct or renovate facilities in such a manner as to provide the 25 greatest cost-effective energy savings possible. Design emphasizing efficiency, functionality, and energy conservation shall be 26 reflected in program statements, schematic design documents, design 27 28 development documents, and construction documents. The state building division of the Department of Administrative Services and the Department 29 of Environment and Energy shall provide technical assistance to the state 30 agencies, upon request, to assist them in providing for energy-efficient 31

The Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges is hereby 16 17 authorized to construct laboratory, classroom, office, and herbarium 18 space for a Rangeland Center at Chadron State College. The amount of Rangeland Center project costs to be met by appropriations pursuant to 19 20 this section is estimated at \$3,696,470. The board is also authorized to renovate the U.S. Conn Library at Wayne State College. The amount of U.S. 21 Conn Library project costs to be met by appropriations pursuant to this 22 23 section is estimated at \$12,000,000. The board is also authorized to renovate and construct an addition to the Math Science Building at 24 25 Chadron State College. The amount of project costs to be met by 26 appropriations pursuant to this section is estimated at \$24,094,000. The board is further authorized to expend such other amounts as it may secure 27 28 from other sources for completion of the projects.

Beginning with the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2013, and continuing through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2035, the Legislature shall appropriate each fiscal year from the General Fund an amount not

less than \$2,216,000 to be used by the board to pay the costs of 1 2 constructing a Rangeland Center at Chadron State College, renovating the U.S. Conn Library at Wayne State College, and renovating and constructing 3 4 an addition to the Math Science Building at Chadron State College. The 5 board may enter into long-term financing contracts with any person, firm, or corporation for the Rangeland Center, U.S. Conn Library, and Math 6 Science Building projects. The payments of the costs of the projects may 7 occur over a contract period not to extend beyond June 30, 2035. 8

9 The board shall not pledge the credit of the State of Nebraska for the payment of any sum owing on account of such contract, except that 10 there may be pledged for the payment of any such contract any 11 appropriations made by the Legislature for such purpose. No contract 12 13 shall be entered into pursuant to this section without prior approval by 14 resolution by the board. The board may also convey, lease, or lease back all or any part of the Rangeland Center, U.S. Conn Library, and Math 15 16 Science Building projects and the land on which such projects are 17 situated to such person, firm, or corporation as the board may contract with pursuant to this section to facilitate the long-term payment of the 18 costs of the Rangeland Center, U.S. Conn Library, and Math Science 19 Building projects. Any such conveyance or lease shall provide that when 20 the costs of the Rangeland Center, U.S. Conn Library, and Math Science 21 Building projects have been paid, together with interest and other costs 22 23 thereon, the Rangeland Center, U.S. Conn Library, and Math Science 24 Building projects and the land on which such projects are located shall become the property of the board. The board may schedule contractual 25 payments on a monthly, quarterly, or semiannual basis consistent with the 26 27 state fiscal year. On or before August 31, 2035, any funds appropriated from the General Fund for the projects held in the state treasury and 28 held by any trustee which are not necessary to meet the terms of any 29 long-term financing agreements entered into pursuant to this section 30 shall be transferred to the General Fund. 31

- (1) It is the intent of the Legislature that after the terms of any long-term financing agreements have been met for the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture at Curtis Education Center, the annual \$820,000 General Fund appropriation as contained in Laws 2017, LB 330, section 35, be continued through 2050. The annual \$820,000 General Fund appropriation shall be used for renewal, renovations, or repair of existing university facilities.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that after the terms of any long-term financing agreements have been met for the College of Nursing Building Lincoln Division, the annual \$1,477,000 General Fund appropriation as contained in Laws 2017, LB 330, section 37, be continued through 2050. The annual \$1,477,000 General Fund appropriation shall be used for renewal, renovations, or repair of existing university facilities.

The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska shall report to the Clerk of the Legislature and to the Governor an initial five-year plan of projects no later than October 15, 2021.
- (7) The Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska shall provide to the Task Force for Building Renewal semiannual reports concerning the status of each project receiving funding from this program.
