1 Section 1. Section 48-1203, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2020, is amended to read:
- 3 48-1203 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and section
- 4 48-1203.01, every employer shall pay to each of his or her employees a
- 5 minimum wage of:
- 6 (a) Seven dollars and twenty-five cents per hour through December
- 7 31, 2014;
- 8 (b) Eight dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2015, through
- 9 December 31, 2015; and
- 10 <u>(a)</u> (c) Nine dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2016<u>, through</u>
- 11 <u>December 31, 2021;</u> -
- 12 (b) Ten dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2022, through
- 13 <u>December 31, 2022;</u>
- 14 (c) Eleven dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2023, through
- 15 December 31, 2023;
- 16 <u>(d) Twelve dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2024, through</u>
- 17 December 31, 2024;
- 18 <u>(e) Thirteen dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2025, through</u>
- 19 <u>December 31, 2025;</u>
- 20 <u>(f) Fourteen dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2026, through</u>
- 21 <u>December 31, 2026;</u>
- 22 (g) Fifteen dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2027, through
- 23 <u>December 31, 2027;</u>
- 24 (h) Sixteen dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2028, through
- 25 December 31, 2028;
- 26 (i) Seventeen dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2029, through
- 27 December 31, 2029;
- 28 (j) Eighteen dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2030, through
- 29 December 31, 2030;

1 (1) Twenty dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2032, through

- 2 <u>December 31, 2032; and</u>
- 3 (m) The adjusted hourly rate on and after January 1, 2033. For
- 4 purposes of this subdivision, the adjusted hourly rate shall be
- 5 determined annually by the Commissioner of Labor and shall be equal to
- 6 the minimum wage from the previous calendar year increased by the
- 7 percentage increase, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban
- 8 <u>Consumers, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau</u>
- 9 of Labor Statistics, for the twelve months ending on June 30 of such
- 10 previous calendar year.
- 11 (2) For persons compensated by way of gratuities such as waitresses,
- 12 waiters, hotel bellhops, porters, and shoeshine persons, the employer
- 13 shall pay wages at the minimum rate of two dollars and thirteen cents per
- 14 hour, plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered. The sum of
- 15 wages and gratuities received by each person compensated by way of
- 16 gratuities shall equal or exceed the minimum wage rate provided in
- 17 subsection (1) of this section. In determining whether or not the
- 18 individual is compensated by way of gratuities, the burden of proof shall
- 19 be upon the employer.
- 20 (3) Any employer employing student-learners as part of a bona fide
- 21 vocational training program shall pay such student-learners' wages at a
- 22 rate of at least seventy-five percent of the minimum wage rate which
- 23 would otherwise be applicable.
