Overview

The Lancaster County Youth Services Center reports all instances of room confinement that total to over 1 hour in a 24-hour period. For example, if a youth is placed in their room for a time out for 30 minutes, in their room for our safety check for 45 minutes, then there are 2 instances for the day that total over 1 hour.

There were 59 unique juveniles with room confinement time totally 1544.11 hours.

Confinement Time

- 25.78 hours for medical isolation (primarily time pending COVID test results)
- 604.93 hours for non-medical occurrences
 - 146.83 hours for administrative purposes (security system malfunctions, emergency transportations to hospital, multiple court transports occurring at the same time)
 - 458.10 for the safety of the juvenile or others in the immediate area

Over 4-hour Justification

- Medical instances – youth are confined until COVID testing is completed or due to intoxication upon intake.
- Safety occurrences are due to youth placing other youth or staff in imminent danger and refusal to process with staff on a STR (Safe to Return) plan to general population.

- Medical instances – youth are confined until COVID testing is completed or due to intoxication upon intake.
- Safety occurrences are due to youth placing other youth or staff in imminent danger and refusal to process with staff on a STR (Safe to Return) plan to general population.
- Administrative instances were due to multiple emergencies occurring at the same time in conjunction with transportations to the hospital and court.
