LB 16 changes provisions related to the make-up of the State Electrical Board and issuance of licenses.

Section 4 provides a definition for "United States military" under the Occupational Board Reform Act.

Sections 8 and 9 allow individuals with criminal convictions to submit an application for licensure, government certification, or state recognition of the individual's personal qualifications to the appropriate occupational board.

The State Electrical Division estimates no fiscal impact.

The Department of Health and Human Services estimates the provisions of LB 16 will have minimal fiscal impact for the Division of Public Health, but those costs can be absorbed with current resources.

There is no basis to disagree with these estimates.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB16 requires occupational boards to issue certain credentials based on credentials or work experience in another jurisdiction and make a determination regarding an applicant with a criminal conviction, provides for jurisprudential examinations and appeals from denial of a license, and changes requirements for membership of the State Electrical Board.

There will be fiscal impact for the Division of Public Health (DPH) to implement LB16 which includes:

- Creating and revising applications for licensure with a new pathway for licensure based on reciprocity
 will require 40 hours of work for each of the 4 Health Licensing Coordinators, given the number of
 professions that are impacted.
- Adding new credential pathways to the License Information System (LIS) will require 1-2 weeks of work for the IT Business Systems Analyst to complete.
- Providing notifications of changes to stakeholders will require one additional hour for 4 DHHS Program Manager IIs and 2 additional hours for 4 Administrative Technicians.
- Updating the DHHS website will require 80 hours of work for the Administrative Specialist in the DHHS Occupational Licensure Unit who maintains licensure-related web pages.
- Making changes in the rules and regulations for all occupations within the DHHS Occupational Licensure
 Unit will require 80 hours of work for each of the 4 DHHS Program Manager II positions that oversee
 licensure of professions and occupations.

This new work can be performed by existing staff without additional resources.

Revenue regarding occupational boards issuing certain credentials based on credentials or work experience in another jurisdiction:

Given licensing and certification fees are already set in regulations, this bill should not create a significant
amount of additional revenue; however, there is no data available as to how many individuals may qualify
under section 2(b) relating to experience for an occupation in a state that does not use an occupational
license or government certification to regulate the occupation.

Revenue regarding changes to the provisions relating to preliminary applications by individuals with a criminal conviction:

• The \$100 fee for preliminary application reviews is currently set in statute (84-947). Since 2018, professional boards administered by the DHHS Occupational Licensure Unit have only reviewed three

preliminary applications from individuals with criminal convictions (two relating to massage therapy, and one relating to dentistry).
