In June 2021, MLTC announced that all Nebraskans eligible for Medicaid Expansion will receive equal coverage for benefits such as dental services, vision care, and over-the-counter medications, effective October 1, 2021. Nebraska also withdrew its application for the Section 1115 Heritage Health Adult demonstration program, which would have allowed Nebraskans with “Basic” benefits through Medicaid Expansion to qualify for “Prime” benefits by actively participating in their healthcare and community engagement activities.

Capitation rates are issued to the managed care plans to provide coverage for expansion beneficiaries and are set in a routine manner similar to all other Medicaid members.
