## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 281**

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to nursing; to amend sections 38-204, 38-605, 38-703, 38-904, 38-2213, 38-2214, and 38-2306, Reissue Revised 2 3 Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 38-167 and 38-2216, Revised 4 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2024; to eliminate and rename certain boards as prescribed; requirements 5 to change and 6 qualifications for members of the Board of Nursing; to eliminate 7 qualifications and duties for the Board of Advanced Practice 8 Registered Nurses; to eliminate obsolete provisions; to harmonize 9 provisions; to provide an operative date; to repeal the original 10 sections; and to outright repeal sections 38-205, 38-206, and 38-2307, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska. 11

24 38-2213 (1) The board shall consist of eight registered nurse 25 members, two licensed practical nurse members, and <u>three</u> <del>two</del> public 26 members. The registered nurses on the board shall be from the following 27 areas: (a) One practical nurse educator; (b) one associate degree or 28 diploma nurse educator; (c) one baccalaureate nurse educator; (d) two 29 nursing service administrators; (e) two staff nurses; and (f) <u>four</u> <del>one</del> 30 advanced practice registered <u>nurses</u> <del>nurse</del>.

31 (2) The State Board of Health shall attempt to ensure that the

1 membership of the Board of Nursing is representative of acute care, long-2 term care, and community-based care. A minimum of three and a maximum of 3 five members shall be appointed from each congressional district, and 4 each member shall have been a bona fide resident of the congressional 5 district from which he or she is appointed for a period of at least one 6 year prior to the time of the appointment of such member.

7 Sec. 7. Section 38-2214, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 8 amended to read:

9 38-2214 (1) Each licensed practical nurse educator on the board 10 shall (a) be a registered nurse currently licensed in the state, (b) have 11 graduated with a graduate degree in nursing or a related field of study, 12 (c) have had a minimum of five years' experience in administration, 13 teaching, or consultation in practical nurse education, and (d) be 14 currently employed as a practical nurse educator.

(2) Each associate degree or diploma nurse educator on the board and the baccalaureate nurse educator on the board shall (a) be a registered nurse currently licensed in the state, (b) have graduated with a graduate degree in nursing, (c) have had a minimum of five years' experience in administration, teaching, or consultation in nursing education, and (d) be currently employed in the field being represented.

(3) Each staff nurse on the board shall (a) be a registered nurse
currently licensed in the state, (b) have had a minimum of five years'
experience in nursing, and (c) be currently employed as a staff nurse in
the provision of patient care services.

(4) Each nursing service administrator on the board shall (a) be a registered nurse currently licensed in the state, (b) have had a minimum of five years' experience in nursing service administration, and (c) be currently employed in such field.

(5) Each licensed practical nurse member shall (a) have completed at
least four years of high school study, (b) be licensed as a licensed
practical nurse in this state, (c) have obtained a certificate or diploma

1 from a state-approved practical nursing program, (d) have been actively 2 engaged in practical nursing for at least five years, and (e) be 3 currently employed in the provision of patient care services as a 4 licensed practical nurse in the state.

5 (6) Each public member shall meet the requirements of section6 38-165.

7 (7) <u>Each</u> The advanced practice registered nurse on the board shall 8 (a) have a minimum of five years' experience as an advanced practice 9 registered nurse, (b) be currently employed as an advanced practice 10 registered nurse, and (c) be licensed as an advanced practice registered 11 nurse.

12 (8) On and after January 1, 2026, the terms for advanced practice 13 registered nurses serving on the board shall be as follows: One shall be 14 appointed for a three-year term, one shall be appointed for a four-year 15 term, and one shall be appointed for a five-year term. All subsequent 16 appointments shall be for five-year terms.

17 (9) The preferred representation of the advanced practice registered 18 nurses on the board shall be as follows: (a) One certified registered 19 nurse anesthetist, (b) one nurse practitioner, (c) one clinical nurse 20 specialist and (d) one certified nurse midwife. If such representation is 21 not possible, the vacancies may be filled based on the composition of the 22 applicant pool.

23 (8) Members serving on December 1, 2008, may complete their
24 respective terms even if they do not meet the requirements for
25 appointment as changed by Laws 2007, LB 463.

1 (2) If requested, issue or decline to issue advisory opinions 2 defining acts which in the opinion of the board are or are not permitted practice of nursing. Such opinions shall be considered 3 in the 4 informational only and are nonbinding. Practice-related information provided by the board to registered nurses or licensed practical nurses 5 licensed under the Nurse Practice Act shall be made available by the 6 board on request to nurses practicing in this state under a license 7 issued by a state that is a party to the Nurse Licensure Compact; 8

9 (3) Establish rules and regulations for approving and classifying 10 programs preparing nurses, taking into consideration administrative and 11 organizational patterns, the curriculum, students, student services, 12 faculty, and instructional resources and facilities, and provide surveys 13 for each educational program as determined by the board;

14 (4) Approve educational programs which meet the requirements of the15 Nurse Practice Act;

16 (5) Keep a record of all its proceedings and compile an annual 17 report for distribution;

18 (6) Adopt rules and regulations establishing standards for
19 delegation of nursing activities, including training or experience
20 requirements, competency determination, and nursing supervision;

21 (7) Collect data regarding nursing;

(8) Provide consultation and conduct conferences, forums, studies,and research on nursing practice and education;

(9) Join organizations that develop and regulate the national
nursing licensure examinations and exclusively promote the improvement of
the legal standards of the practice of nursing for the protection of the
public health, safety, and welfare; and

(10) Administer the Nurse Licensure Compact. In reporting
information to the coordinated licensure information system under Article
VII of the compact, the department may disclose personal identifying
information about a nurse, including his or her social security number; -
