- A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to state hospitals for the mentally ill; to
 amend section 83-338, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to
 change requirements for priority of admission; and to repeal the
 original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 83-338, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 83-338 (1) State hospitals for the mentally ill shall prioritize the 4 following patients for admission If at any time it becomes necessary, for 5 lack of capacity or other cause, to establish priorities for the admission of patients into the state hospitals for the mentally ill, 6 7 admission shall be limited to: (a) Patients whose care in the state hospital is necessary in order to protect the public health and safety; 8 9 (b) defendants who are determined by a court to be incompetent to stand 10 trial and who remain lodged in the county jail; and (c) patients committed by a mental health board under the Nebraska Mental Health 11 Commitment Act or the Sex Offender Commitment Act, by a district court, 12 13 or by a tribal court as provided in section 71-964 or 71-1226.01 $\frac{1}{2}$ (d) patients who are most likely to be benefited by treatment in the state 14 15 hospitals, regardless of whether such patients are committed by a mental health board or whether such patients seek voluntary admission to one of 16 17 the state hospitals; and (e) when cases are equally meritorious, in all 18 other respects, patients who are indigent.

19 (2) The Lincoln Regional Center shall provide a minimum number of
 20 beds equal to the following percentages of total available capacity:

21 (a) Ten percent for patients entering the facility pursuant to
 22 subdivision (1)(a) of this section;

23 (b) Ten percent for patients entering the facility pursuant to 24 subdivision (1)(b) of this section;

25 (c) Thirty percent for patients entering the facility pursuant to
26 subdivision (1)(c) of this section;

27 (d) Ten percent for patients entering the facility pursuant to 28 subdivision (1)(d) of this section;

29 (e) Ten percent for patients entering the facility pursuant to
 30 subdivision (1)(e) of this section; and

31 (f) Thirty percent to remain unallocated for the Department of

Health and Human Services to allocate according to the priorities
 established in subsection (1) of this section as needed to reduce
 existing waiting lists.

4 (2) (3) Beginning on or before November 1, 2022, the Department of 5 Health and Human Services shall make available on its website a weekly 6 report on the capacity and status of state-operated mental health 7 facilities, including, but not limited to, the capacity and wait times 8 associated with each priority category established in subsection (1) of 9 this section.
