- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Uniform Civil Remedies for Unauthorized
- 2 Disclosure of Intimate Images Act; to amend sections 25-3502 and
- 3 25-3503, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2024; to redefine
- 4 terms; to provide liability for images created by computer
- 5 generation or digital manipulation; and to repeal the original
- 6 sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- **Section 1.** Section 25-3502, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2024, is amended to read:
- 3 25-3502 In the Uniform Civil Remedies for Unauthorized Disclosure of
- 4 Intimate Images Act:
- 5 (1) Consent means affirmative, conscious, and voluntary
- 6 authorization by an individual with legal capacity to give authorization.
- 7 (2) Depicted individual means an individual whose body is shown in
- 8 whole or in part in an intimate image, including by means of computer
- 9 generation or digital manipulation.
- 10 (3) Disclosure means transfer, publication, or distribution to
- 11 another person. Disclose has a corresponding meaning.
- 12 (4) Identifiable means recognizable by a person other than the
- 13 depicted individual:
- 14 (A) from an intimate image itself; or
- 15 (B) from an intimate image and identifying characteristic displayed
- in connection with the intimate image; or -
- 17 <u>(C) from information displayed in connection with an intimate image.</u>
- 18 (5) Identifying characteristic means information that may be used to
- 19 identify a depicted individual.
- 20 (6) Individual means a human being.
- 21 (7) Intimate image means a photograph, film, video recording, or
- 22 other similar medium that shows:
- 23 (A) the uncovered genitals, pubic area, anus, or female post-
- 24 pubescent nipple of a depicted individual; or
- 25 (B) a depicted individual engaging in or being subjected to sexual
- 26 conduct.
- 27 (8) Person means an individual, estate, business or nonprofit
- 28 entity, public corporation, government or governmental subdivision,
- 29 agency, or instrumentality, or other legal entity.
- 30 (9) Sexual conduct includes:
- 31 (A) masturbation;

- 1 (B) genital, anal, or oral sex;
- 2 (C) sexual penetration of, or with, an object;
- 3 (D) bestiality; or
- 4 (E) the transfer of semen onto a depicted individual.

- 7 25-3503 (a) In this section:
- 8 (1) Harm includes physical harm, economic harm, and emotional
- 9 distress whether or not accompanied by physical or economic harm.
- 10 (2) Private means:
- 11 (A) created or obtained under circumstances in which a depicted
- 12 individual had a reasonable expectation of privacy; or
- 13 (B) made accessible through theft, bribery, extortion, fraud, false
- 14 pretenses, voyeurism, or exceeding authorized access to an account,
- 15 message, file, device, resource, or property; or -
- 16 (C) created by means of computer generation or digital manipulation
- 17 without the consent of the depicted individual.
- 18 (b) Except as otherwise provided in section 25-3504, a depicted
- 19 individual who is identifiable and who suffers harm from a person's
- 20 intentional disclosure or threatened disclosure of an intimate image that
- 21 was private without the depicted individual's consent has a cause of
- 22 action against the person if the person knew or acted with reckless
- 23 disregard for whether:
- 24 (1) the depicted individual did not consent to the disclosure;
- 25 (2) the intimate image was private; and
- 26 (3) the depicted individual was identifiable.
- 27 (c) The following conduct by a depicted individual does not
- 28 establish by itself that the individual consented to the disclosure of
- 29 the intimate image which is the subject of an action under the Uniform
- 30 Civil Remedies for Unauthorized Disclosure of Intimate Images Act or that
- 31 the individual lacked a reasonable expectation of privacy:

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- 1 (1) consent to creation of the image; or
- 2 (2) previous consensual disclosure of the image.
- 3 (d) A depicted individual who does not consent to the sexual conduct
- 4 or uncovering of the part of the body depicted in an intimate image of
- 5 the individual retains a reasonable expectation of privacy even if the
- 6 image was created when the individual was in a public place.
