LEGISLATIVE BILL 411

Introduced by Dungan, 26. Read first time January 17, 2025 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Teacher Recruitment and
2	Retention Act; to amend section 79-8,114, Reissue Revised Statutes
3	of Nebraska; to change provisions relating to eligibility for
4	grants; to repeal the original section; and to declare an emergency.
5	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-8,114, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
 is amended to read:

3 79-8,114 (1) A teacher <u>is eligible to receive a grant as prescribed</u> 4 <u>in this section may apply to the department for a grant</u>. The department 5 shall not prioritize a grant based upon the school where the <u>teacher</u> 6 applicant teaches. <u>The department shall distribute all grants</u> 7 <u>automatically to the school district employing the eligible teacher. The</u> 8 <u>school district shall distribute such grant funds to the teacher in</u> 9 <u>accordance with this section.</u>

10 (2) <u>This subsection applies until July 1, 2025.</u> A teacher is
 11 eligible to <u>receive</u> apply for:

12 (a) A retention one grant of two thousand five hundred dollars if 13 the teacher has signed a contract to complete such teacher's second 14 complete school year of full-time employment as a teacher at a Nebraska 15 school in school year 2023-24 $_{T}$ or 2024-25 $_{T}$ 2025-26, or 2026-27;

16 (b) A retention two grant of two thousand five hundred dollars if 17 the teacher has signed a contract to complete such teacher's fourth 18 complete school year of full-time employment as a teacher at a Nebraska 19 school in school year 2023-24 $_{7}$ or 2024-25 $_{7}$ 2025-26, or 2026-27;

20 (c) A retention three grant of two thousand five hundred dollars if 21 the teacher has signed a contract to complete such teacher's sixth 22 complete school year of full-time employment as a teacher at a Nebraska 23 school in school year 2023-24 $_{T}$ or 2024-25 $_{T}$ 2025-26, or 2026-27; and

(d)(i) A high-need retention grant of five thousand dollars if on or
after June 2, 2023, a teacher:

26 (A) Obtains an endorsement in special education, mathematics,
 27 science, technology, or dual credit; and

(B)(I) <u>Prior</u> For an application submitted prior to April 17, 2024,
signs a contract to complete a school year of full-time employment as a
teacher at a Nebraska school in school year 2024-25 , 2025-26, or
2026-27; or

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1	(II) <u>On</u> For an application submitted on or after April 17, 2024,
2	signs a contract to complete a school year of full-time employment as a
3	teacher to teach in such endorsement area at a Nebraska school in school
4	year 2024-25 , 2025-26, or 2026-27 .
5	(ii) A teacher shall only be eligible to receive one high-need
6	retention grant.
7	(3)(a) This subsection applies beginning July 1, 2025.
8	(b) The department shall automatically provide a retention grant to
9	a teacher who is eligible pursuant to subdivision (c) of this section.
10	<u>(c) A teacher is eligible to receive:</u>
11	<u>(i) For such teacher's first through sixth school year of full-time</u>
12	employment teaching at a Nebraska school, a retention grant of two
13	thousand five hundred dollars per school year;
14	<u>(ii) For such teacher's seventh through fifteenth school year of</u>
15	full-time employment teaching at a Nebraska school, a retention grant of
16	three thousand dollars per school year;
17	<u>(iii) Beginning with such teacher's sixteenth year of full-time</u>
18	employment teaching at a Nebraska school and each year of full-time
19	employment teaching at a Nebraska school thereafter, a retention grant of
20	four thousand dollars per school year; and
21	<u>(iv)(A) A high-need retention grant of five thousand dollars if on</u>
22	<u>or after July 1, 2025, a teacher:</u>
23	(I) Obtains an endorsement in special education, mathematics,
24	science, technology, or dual-credit; and
25	(II) Signs a contract to complete a year of full-time employment as
26	<u>a teacher to teach in such endorsement area at a Nebraska school.</u>
27	<u>(B) A teacher shall only be eligible to receive one high-need</u>
28	retention grant. A teacher that received a high-need retention grant
29	prior to July 1, 2025, pursuant to subdivision (2)(d) of this section
30	shall not be eligible for a high-need retention grant pursuant to
31	<u>subdivision (3)(c)(iv) of this section.</u>

 Nebraska, is repealed.

3 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
4 passed and approved according to law.
