LB 1013 amends the Nebraska County and City Lottery Act, Nebraska Revised Statutes Section 9-647, to provide that a licensee holding a Class C or Class I liquor license with an extended closing time designation may conduct a lottery up to 2:00 a.m. on the days the licensee is authorized to sell alcoholic liquor, including beer, until 2:00 a.m.

LB 1013 also amends the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, Nebraska Revised Statutes Sections 53-124 and 53-179 to provide for Class C and Class I liquor licenses with an extended closing time designation in counties which encompass a city of the metropolitan class. Such designation would allow the holder of such a license to stay open and sell alcoholic liquor, including beer, until 2:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday unless the local governing board has established an earlier closing time. At this time this provision would only apply to Douglas County.

The bill appears to have no fiscal impact to state revenue or expenditures.

**IMPACT TO POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS:**

The impact to political subdivisions is indeterminate.
