LB 567 amends the Nebraska Liquor Control Act, Nebraska Revised Statute Section 53-1,104.

The bill adds language to this section to provide that any penalty ordered by the Liquor Control Commission as a result of sale or possession by a minor as a result of a compliance check shall not be considered a previous violation when assessing penalties for subsequent violations.

The Liquor Control Commission indicated they impose approximately 1487 days of suspension per year on sales to minors with two or more offenses. They estimate that 520 days less suspensions will be imposed per year as a result of LB 567. As a result the fiscal impact would be a reduction in penalties (fines) paid of \$52,000. This money is ultimately credited to the Permanent School Fund.

There is no basis to disagree with the Liquor Control Commission's estimate of fiscal impact.

Explanation of Estimate:

The commission imposes roughly 1487 days of suspension per year on sales to minors with 2nd or more offenses. It is estimated that 520 days less suspension will be imposed per year if the bill passes.

Therefore:

Current: 1487 days assessed at \$100.00 per day = \$ 148,700.00
 Proposal: 520 less days imposed = \$ -52,000.00

 Estimated Net Decrease to School Fund = \$ -96,700.00
