Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB643 relates to cities of the first and second class. The bill would eliminate specific citation of the height of weeds, grasses, or worthless vegetation that such cities may, by ordinance, declare to be a nuisance. The bill would authorize such cities to establish, by ordinance, the height at which such vegetation constitutes a nuisance. Current law prescribes the method of notice (personal service, certified mail, publication in a newspaper, posting notice on the lot / ground on which such a nuisance is to be abated and removed) relating to such nuisances. LB643 would authorize first and second class cities to establish, by ordinance, methods of notice with respect to such nuisances. Any fiscal impacts relating to LB643 and affected political subdivisions would appear dependent upon ordinances that may be adopted by first and second class cities as provided by the bill. As such, related impacts are indeterminate.
