LB 1058 renames the State Advisory Committee on Problem Gambling and Addiction Services to be the State Committee on Problem Gambling. The responsibilities of the renamed committee are broadened in the bill. The bill also provides intent language for the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used primarily for counseling and treatment services for problem gamblers and their families.

It is possible the Department of Health and Human Services may incur a minimal increase in administrative costs in support of the activities of the State Committee on Problem Gambling. The Department indicates that any increased expenses can be handled with existing resources. The intent language relative to using the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund primarily for counseling and treatment services will not have a fiscal impact in terms of total dollars expended, but could result in funds being expended for the purposes required in the bill rather than other activities.
