LB156 amends both the Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act and the State Tort Claims Act. LB156 repeals the third party liability requirement for pursuits by law enforcement officers. Current law provides that in case of death, injury or property damage to any innocent third party proximately caused by the action of a law enforcement officer damages shall be paid to the third party by the political subdivision or the state.

Repeal of these provisions of law would decrease costs for both the state and the political subdivisions for the cost of insurance and a decrease in claims. The amount of savings cannot be determined.
