This bill would change child custody determination provisions. The bill has the emergency clause and it becomes operative on July 1, 2010.

The Department of Health and Human Services estimates no fiscal impact.

The Supreme Court does not anticipate a significant fiscal impact from this bill, and it states the following regarding this bill:

LB 901 allows for mandatory mediation to be waived under certain circumstances after holding an evidentiary hearing. The impact on judicial workload is not expected to be significant. Supreme Court approved mediation centers, however, may be impacted. There is no fiscal impact regarding the language of the best interests of a minor.
